This was a BIG hit with passersby, so we did it again at the next event – and it garnered lots of participation there as well. He plans to have us meet at the Tukwila Foster Golf Course Clubhouse to exchange ideas, experiences and advice on how to best work our precincts Day (starting around 5 p.m. and continuing as long as PCOs are around). 2008 Caucuses Are Coming

Our Caucus Chair George Summers has been working hard on plans to organize our precinct caucuses for February 9, 2007. That sounds far away, but next month we will start making agreements with facilities where we will hold these caucuses. On July 23, George assembled a core group to go over information about facilities, examine previous turnout numbers and analyze what locations appear to be the most effective. It was a good exchange of ideas and we left with assignments to talk with past conveners about locations we've used and some new locations we are considering.

It is very im-

portant that we plan and carry this activity off well – because it is a vital part of our hand in what the Party does, with impacts that go through to the Democratic National Convention AND it's a vital source to recruit and retain new members.

Alexander Hamilton was confident that the US economy should be a system of credits defined by the constitution. Brilliant as an economic strategist but terrible as a politician he had to reach deep within himself to find the resources to convince our founding fathers of the necessity to borrow money, guaranteeing repayment by federal securities known to us as Treasury Notes, to pay the debt left by the American revolution. Repayment was mandated by Article VI of the Constitution. The sprightly Hamilton also saw this as a way to promote the general welfare of our new nation.

The highly literate, Revolutionary War veteran anticipated manufacturing as the backbone of the economy. To avoid burdening the struggling factories with new taxes he persuaded his detractors to impose a tariff on imports, providing the treasury with the needed cash flow. The first Secretary of the Treasury influenced Congress to authorize building a ten ship fleet of Revenue Cutters in 1790 to enforce the tariff. The Revenue Cutter Service continues to this day in the form of the US Coast Guard, celebrating their founding anniversary on August 4.




