Also, I would like to hear from PCOs that I haven't contacted yet about what they are able to do next year for registering voters and getting out the vote. Honest assessments please—we know that some people are not physically able to walk, and that others have many other commitments and responsibilities. Any way that you can contribute in this difficult year will help. WSDCC State Committee Woman - Kate Kruller

This quarter, the Washington State Democratic Central Committee met in Bellingham on September 17, 2011.

As a member of the Rules Committee I represented you in the process of learning about WSDCC Executive Committee changes to the Delegate Selection and Affirmative Action Plan. Essentially, the Executive Board put forth the proposal that the State Central Committee direct legislative district organizations to begin meeting within their new geographic boundaries within 30 days of adoption by the legislature.

David McDonald said we are in a unique situation in 2012. In 1992 we used the 20 new CD boundaries but probably used the old precinct caucus boundaries. McDonald spoke with Patrice Taylor at the DNC office of Party Affairs. She understands why we want to make the changes. She is going to present our proposal to the DNC RBC co-chairs. The WSDCC Rules Committee voted to support this.

In another matter, the Rules Committee passed a motion to remove the lines of the DSAAP reading "The minutes shall include the full text of all presented resolutions." This change eliminates the requirement for a rapid assembly of resolutions turned in at the legislative district caucuses to be fully documented in the minutes in time for the County conventions (a tedious task within an extremely short turnaround time). Resolutions will follow the normal path performed outside of the caucus process. The WSDCC Rules Committee voted to support this.

During the main WSDCC General Session, the Washington State Democrats endorse Jay Inslee for Governor and WSDCC Chair, Dwight Pelz, recognized all candidates at the meeting that were running for office in 2011.

Also, a motion passed stating "the WSDCC authorizes the State Party Chair to enter into negotiations with the legislature regarding Precinct Committee Officer elections. The Chair would take any terms of these negotiations to the Executive Board, and the Executive Board would have to approve the results of the negotiations."

In summary, the following resolutions were passed by the WSDCC:

- i. Resolution 537 Resolution Calling for Federal Recognition of the Duwamish Tribe
- ii. Resolution 542 Restore Laws for the Separation of Banking Insurance and Security Firms

iii. Resolution 544 – Resolution on Tax Expenditures

iv. Resolution 546 - Resolution on State Investment Trust

v. Resolution 549 - Resolution Calling on Congress to Adopt New Priorities

vi. Resolution 550 - Reallocate Military Funding

vii. Resolution 552 - Resolution on Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid

viii. Resolution 553 - Resolution to the WSDCC Rules Committee Regarding Resolutions (see 16.E.i below)

ix. Resolution 555 – Endorse and Support the Passage of Initiative Measure No. 502 to Legalize, Tax, and Regulate Marijuana for Adults 21 and Over
